The Lorain County Collection Center located at 540 S. Abbe Rd., Elyria will continue limited operations on Wednesdays from 12pm-6pm and Saturdays from 9am-3pm.

The Grafton Tire Site located at 17109 Avon Belden Rd, Grafton open Saturdays from 9am to 1pm.

When packing your vehicle, all materials to be dropped off should be in the rear compartment or truck bed of the vehicle (no materials in the front or rear seat), do not place other personal items by items to be dropped off.

Once at the Collection Center or tire sites, participants must remain in their vehicles at all times and facial coverings are required to be serviced. Staff at the Collection Center or tire sites will request to visually see your ID to prove Lorain County residency.

Lorain County residents can bring household hazardous waste, paper for shredding and scrap tires.

Both Lorain County residents and businesses can bring electronic scrap, old books, general recyclables and fluorescent light bulbs.

ACCEPTED

Safely dispose of leftover pharmaceuticals by taking them to the Wellington Village Police Department 117 Willard Memorial Square. Remove labels and drop in the bin located in the lobby anytime day or night.

What Is Compost?

Compost is decomposed organic matter. A compost pile, made up of items like food scraps and yard clippings, is an environment where bacteria, fungi, worms, and insects like spiders and slugs can break it down naturally. The result is a dark, earthy material called compost (or "black gold" as it is known to gardeners) that's a nutrient-rich fertilizer you can add back into the soil.

Benefits of Composting

- Enriches soil, helping retain moisture and suppress plant diseases and pests.
- Reduces the need for chemical fertilizers.
- Encourages the production of beneficial bacteria and fungi that break down organic matter to create humus, a rich nutrient-filled material.
